

Internet Safety – Advice to Parents

- Take an interest in what your daughter is doing online
- Know how to access social networking sites and what safety controls are available to keep your daughter safe while online
- Keep the computer in a family room so you can be more aware of what your daughter is doing
- Remind your daughter of the following good advice:

Never give out personal information	messenger id, email address, mobile numbers, pictures, name, address
Spam/Junk mail	do not reply/access them
Cyber bullying	Report abuse if available on the site or contact CEOP (see link below) and use the “CLICK CEOP” button

- If your daughter finds a photo posted on Facebook you can do the following:
 - To remove your daughter’s name from a particular photo, simply view the photo and click the “Remove Tag” link. It will no longer be linked to your daughter’s profile
 - You can only be tagged in photos by friends. If your daughter is having problems with someone, remove them as a friend from the Friends page
 - To make sure the photo is not shown at all, your daughter will need to talk to the person who posted it. They should be respectful and remove any unwanted photos. N.B. Facebook cannot make users remove photos that do not violate their “Statement of Rights and Responsibilities”.
